

# Salt & Vine Restaurant Coming to Sylvan Heights

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Salt & Vine, Double Dogs sports bar and Farm Burger are among tenants slated for Hill Center Sylvan Heights.

A European-style gourmet marketplace, wine bar and bottle shop called [Salt & Vine](#) is slated to open in June at the Hill Center Sylvan Heights development.

Mattie Jackson plans to open Salt & Vine in Sylvan Heights in June.

Nashville native Mattie Jackson is behind the concept, which will occupy 4,000 square feet at H.G. Hill's development at Charlotte and 40th avenues. [As reported in The Tennessean](#) in December, Jackson originally planned to call her business the Sorting Table.

Salt & Vine will have gourmet prepared foods, specialty cheese and charcuterie, a seasonal small plate dining menu and food and wine pairings. It will offer wines by glass, craft beers on draft, a full bar and a tasting room.

“There's a really exciting marriage between food and wine that too often gets forgotten, even in ‘foodie’ cultures. Our team won't make it feel pretentious or forced. We want to invite guests to come taste and learn with us — we do it because it's fun,” Jackson said in a statement.

Salt & Vine will be open from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

Also planned for H.G. Hill's project at Charlotte and 40th avenues is the second Nashville location of casual bar and restaurant chain [Double Dogs](#) and Nashville's first Farm Burger, a farm-to-table boutique burger joint.

The mixed-use development includes 20,000 square feet of retail space, a 262-unit, four-story apartment building, a dozen townhomes, 14 single-family cottages and a 294-space parking garage.

Construction on Hill Center Sylvan Heights began in early 2015 after H.G. Hill assembled the land for the roughly 8-acre site.
